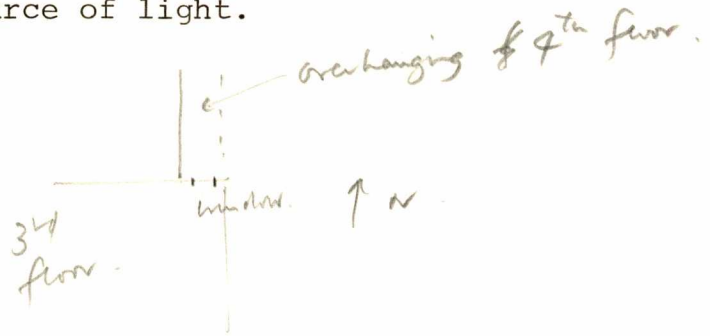

6. Similar question. On the third floor, ~~x~~ we have ~~xxxx~~ two windows, looking out from the nurses rooms, to the north. They are facing north - which is legally allowed... but they have the roof over the area which they look out to... because the building goes back over the hospital. Is this allowed, as a legal source of light.
