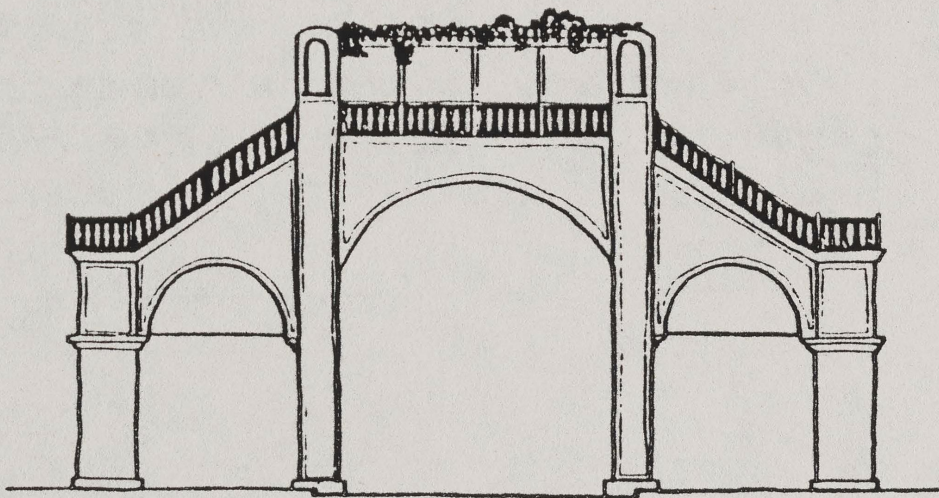


FILM ON CHRISTOPHER ALEXANDER

Those *EAP* readers interested in the work of Berkeley architect Christopher Alexander will want to see a new film on his ideas and work, produced and directed by award-winning filmmaker Ruth Landy. Entitled *Places for the Soul: The Architecture of Christopher Alexander*, the film centers on Alexander's life aim: the creation of beautiful, timeless buildings whose sense of wholeness unites thought and feeling, and creates a sense of place and wholeness.
