I am enclosing a letter from Mr. Javadi, written to you a while back and was meant to be sent in Persian, but I decided to save you the trouble and translate it! It is an emotional letter and perhaps rather vague, but we both felt it is best to send it as is.

I can not truly express our feelings about making a connection with you, we might be strangers to you but you are a very familiar friend to us.
